Distorted Audio in an Old Receiver by W1HFN

A while back, a friend of mine was cleaning out his shack and offered me an old Collins 51J-3 receiver. As a big fan of any thing with "Collins" on the label, I was happy to accept. Manufactured in the years 1952-1956, it is a true example of the "boat anchor" radio, weighing 43 pounds, having a complement of 18 tubes and an original price of \$1000.00.

After I got it home and started tuning around, I found the audio quite distorted, not only on AM but CW as well. Fortunately, he provided me with the original Army / Air Force tech manual which had the schematic and a voltage / resistance chart for each tube. There being no 60 Hertz hum in the audio, I assumed the filter caps were OK. So I started poking around with my volt meter.

I found all the voltages were exactly half of what the chart stated. Some metering of the power supply rectifier (a 5V4 dual diode) revealed the correct 350 volts on the plates, but only 125V on the cathode. Both filaments were lit, so hard to believe the tube was bad. As a test, I made a quickie full-wave rectifier out of two 1000V, 1A diodes (1N4007s) soldered them to an old octal tube base and replaced the 5V4.

Full correct voltages everywhere and perfect clean audio! I found it hard to believe one-half of a tube could go bad like that, but evidently so.
